- 1. Meeting #5: Vernon, BC Technical Bike Tour and Networking Event Synopsis: Lead by the City of Vernon's Transportation Manager, this tour hosted approximately 20 participants with technical discussions along the route and a networking opportunity after the tour.
- 2. Meeting #7: CITE/PIBC Mini Conference in Penticton
 Synopsis: Held in Penticton, BC this 1-day mini conference hosted approximately 55 attendees followed by 2 technical tours: a walking tour and a active transportation network tour by City of Penticton staff.

2. STUDENT / YOUNGER MEMBER SUPPORT

The BC Interior Section was involved with students and younger member support at events that were attended by students from the Kelowna area. Our Section looks forward to increasing involvement with student members of UBC Okanagan in 2025.

3. APPLICATION OF TECHNICAL KNOWLEDGE

Technical tours in Penticton and Vernon included discussions among members about planning and design considerations, and lessons learned. This included the design and implementation of fully separated bike facilities as well as policy discussion on recent provincial land-use bills.

4. NETWORKING EVENTS

Networking was part of the executive planning meetings, the Housing Legislation Impacting Transportation Professionals event, the Vernon Bike Tour and Social Networking, and Fall Conference that the BC Interior Section held in October 2024.

5. K-12 STEM OUTREACH

The BC Interior Section did not participate in any K-12 STEM Outreach events in 2024.

6. NEW MEMBER RECRUITMENT

In fall 2024, our Section was featured in the Transportation Talk magazine which increased exposure of ITE and our section on social media such as linkedIn and through word of mouth in our region's professional community.

7. DIVERSITY AND INCLUSION

The BC Interior Section helped jointly organise the Fall Conference with the PIBC Okanagan Interior Chapter in 2024. This was an opportunity to work with another



discipline and planning resources and ideas with other industries such as planning professionals. This was particularly important in 2024 with sweeping legislative changes impacting both the land-use planning and transportation professions.

8. TRAINING / PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT

The BC Interior Section provided members with technical talks at the Fall Conference in 2024.

9. FIELD TRIPS / TECHNICAL TOURS

The BC Interior Section provided three technical tours in 2024. The first was a bike tour in May hosted by the City of Vernon. The second and third were a walking tour and active transportation network tour by the City of Penticton staff.

10. SERVICE PROJECTS

The BC Interior Section did not participate in any community service projects in 2024.

11. FUNDING SUPPORT

The BC Interior Section raised funds through the Fall Conference and membership dues in 2024. The Section has surplus funds from the CITE Annual Conference hosted in Kelowna, BC in 2016. Funds are invested into student information sessions and other events throughout the year.
